

Strategic Policing Committee

This Committee will consist of nine members. The Committee will meet four times a year and the quorum will be four members.

Purpose

To ensure that the business change programme supports the strategic policing plans, that serious crime and protection issues contribute to enhanced levels of public safety and promoting collaborative issues.

Terms of Reference

1. To oversee and scrutinise Force processes to deliver against the relevant HMIC assessment / inspection requirements and analyse and monitor key performance information as appropriate.
2. To oversee and scrutinise Force corporate planning and performance management arrangements.
3. To oversee the development and implementation of national strategies and plans to deliver performance improvements.
4. To monitor and scrutinise the business change programme that supports the priorities and the planning and resourcing arrangements, ensuring that at the strategic level the programme results in improved operational performance and productivity.
5. To oversee and scrutinise the benefits accrued and lessons learnt from projects after they have been embedded into the business as usual arena.
6. To scrutinise the performance of issues around serious crime and protection and the regional performance framework to ensure they support the delivery of effective and efficient operational policing outcomes.
7. To ensure that data quality systems and processes within the Force and Police Authority are robust, reliable and are being applied in an equitable and consistent manner.
8. To oversee and consider Force arrangements to deliver against key HMIC Baseline Assessment Frameworks.
9. To receive regular reports from the Chief Constable and review progress on the Force's response and preparedness to regional and national policing capabilities in the seven protective service areas of:
 - i. Counter terrorism and domestic extremism
 - ii. Serious organised and cross border crime
 - iii. Civil contingencies and emergency planning
 - iv. Critical incident management
 - v. Major crime
 - vi. Public order
 - vii. Strategic roads policing

10. To oversee the Force risk assessment and gap analyses in relation to protective services.
11. To oversee the Force and Authority input to the work of the Yorkshire and Humberside Joint Police Authorities Committee (JPAC) through providing reports to, receiving reports from, and monitoring progress.
12. To facilitate an effective flow of information between the Regional Chief Constables' Group (RCCG), JPAC and the Police Authority.
13. To consider the governance, accountability and resourcing implications of business cases being considered by JPAC and to ensure effective coordination with the Force Business Change Programme.
14. To consider any matters referred to the Committee by the Police Authority or any other Committee for either determination or recommendation.
15. To refer any matter to any of the Committees of the Police Authority as appropriate.
16. To receive regular updates on developments from Regional Policy Network meetings, consider the implications for the Police Authority and respond accordingly.
17. To have due regard, in exercising its responsibilities to equal opportunities generally and the requirements of all equalities, anti-discrimination and Human Rights legislation, including implementation of the equalities schemes of both the Authority and the Force.
